Great opportunity to regularize the “marriage union” is coming! On October 4, 2109 our north region bishop Most Reverend Mark O’ Connel is doing a “Marriage Con-validation Ceremony at our great church St. Anthony’s to regularize all the irregular unions of catholic marriage as per the invitation of the “Extraordinary Synod on the family”

The Third Extraordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, the first of two synods popularly referred to as the Synod on the Family, was held in Vatican City on 5–19 October 2014 on the topic of Pastoral Challenges of the Family in the Context of Evangelization. The Synod was a gathering of 253 bishops and other participants in preparation for a larger synod with the same theme in October 2015. The participants discussed problems facing the family today, including the effects of war, immigration, domestic violence, sexual orientation, polygamy, inter-religious marriages, cohabitation, the breakdown of marriage, and divorce and remarriage. In particular, the Synod was marked by debate regarding the pastoral care of Catholics living in “irregular unions”, including those civilly remarried after divorce (in particular their desire to receive the Eucharist), unmarried cohabitating couples.

Those who are interested and want to regularize their marriage unions can either fill out the form found in next week’s bulletin and bring to the rectory or call to the rectory and make preparations for this great joyful ceremony. You know, being a part of our big catholic family is a great joy. Let us remove anything that separate us from each other!

On Aug. 25, 2019 Sunday evening I am going to India for a marriage in my family. I am going to be away for two weeks. I will be back on Sept. 11, 2019. Kindly keep me in your valuable prayers. In my absence Fr. Heniston will be in charge of our beautiful parish and of course Fr. George will be around him to support. Kindly give him your continuous love and support. Thank you.

### **The Mystery of the Mass**

**Why do we go to Mass?**

**God doesn't have to love us as a Father; He freely chooses to do so. Nor did he "have to" give us his only Son to die for our sins and grant us the possibility of eternal life. God's creativity is outdone only by his generosity.**

**So rather than asking why we go to Mass, here is the question we should be asking: "Is God worth it?" Is taking one hour a week to worship the God who has blessed us with everything we have worth it? Is having an hour set aside to let God love us while we try to love him worth it? Do we think created things are more important than the One who created them?**

**Everything we have is a gift from God--every blessing in our lives, every person, talent, ability, and interest--every good gift. The Mass is the greatest gift God gives us. When we come to be more aware of our own sins and our own need for a savior, the more clearly we see the Mass as not merely an obligation but an opportunity not to be missed.**

**Why is the priesthood so important?**

**In a nutshell, because without priesthood, there would be no Mass, no celebration of the Eucharist.**

**The role of priests in the Old Testament was simple: They were God's representatives to his people, offering sacrifices on behalf of the people in atonement for their sins.**

**Jesus established a "New Covenant," a new, binding relationship between God and his people, the Church. This New Covenant has a new priesthood, one that shares in the authority of Christ the High Priest. The priests of the Church, then bring to us --and us to God-- through their teaching and ministry (particularly the sacraments). They act in personi Christi ("in the person of Christ"), with Jesus' own authority and power, given to them in their ordination. They are the hands, feet, and voice on earth; they are the instruments God uses to carry out his saving ministry to his people.**

**Think of it this way: The Catholic priesthood is the continuation of Jesus' healing, teaching, and feeding since his ascension. It is Jesus' way of keeping his love and mercy "real" and personal in every generation. In his priests, Jesus is borrowing other men's hands, eyes, and voices to deliver his Body and Blood to each living soul in every generation for their freedom and eternal life. A priest sins and has the same struggles as the rest of us, but he uniquely brings Christ to the world through his ministry.**
