News from the Wheel-House

“Be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves”. (James 1/22)

Hello Everyone,

How are you? Hope and pray that you are all safe and healthy. Last weekend I was delighted to see couple of our parishioners coming back to the church after the Covid-19 lockdown. I know that the virus situation is not great out there and strongly recommend that you all need to protect yourselves and others however I also appreciate you all who are taking initiatives to cater your spiritual needs. It is true and really sad to see people our own parish, who stay away from the church with the reason of virus, can be seen at the stores shopping even without masks. I pray that God may bless them to have the heart to come to the church and take care of their spiritual side as they are doing with their physical side. God bless us all!

Aug. 29, 2021, we celebrate the “Twenty Second Sunday in Ordinary Time”. If this date has fallen on any one of the weekdays the church would have asked us to do the memory of “The Beheading of Saint John the Baptist, martyr”. Do you know why I am talking about this? Because I see a great connection between this weekend’s liturgical readings and that memory. St. John the Baptist did not allow any external pressure to fail himself from keeping God’s commandments. This weekend readings they talk about the importance of keeping the word of God or the Commandments of God. Many a time we find very difficult with that and when we try to reason out why? We find the excuses saying Oh, it is because of this pressure or that pressure, because of this person or that person I failed. But you know, God does not buy excuses. Remember the story of Adam and Eve. I also want to bring to you a beautiful and funny but moral story to drive this message home.

One night, four college students stayed up late partying, even though they knew they had a test the next day. The next morning, they came up with a plan to get out of having to take their test. Each student rolled around in dirt and then went to the teacher’s office. They told the teacher that they had gotten a flat tire the night before, and they spent the entire night pushing their car back to campus.

The students were okay with that because they had been given a chance to study. The test had 2 questions: 1) Your Name \_\_\_\_\_ (1 Points) 2) Which tire was flat? \_\_\_\_\_ (99 Points). To their utter failure each student wrote different answer to the second question 1. Front Right 2. Front Left 3. Back Right 4. Back Left. The moral of this story is: “Aside from making wise decisions, you always need to take responsibility for your actions. This means not blaming other people for your mistakes, not complaining about the reality of the present moment, and not giving in to other people’s pressure”. Hereby I want you to remember the quote from the second reading of this weekend: “Be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves”. (James 1/22) Let God help us not to deceive ourselves!



# Saint Joseph of Arimathea

FIRST CENTURY

FEAST DAY: AUGUST 31



In all four Gospels, Joseph was the brave Jew who asked Pilate for Jesus' crucified body and buried him. Mark calls him "a distinguished member" of the Sanhedrin, while Luke notes that he "had not consented" to the council's plan. In Matthew he is "a rich man," and John says he is a secret disciple of Jesus "for fear of the Jews." He shares his feast with Nicodemus, another Jew who went to Jesus secretly. From medieval times Joseph was associated with Holy Grail legends.
