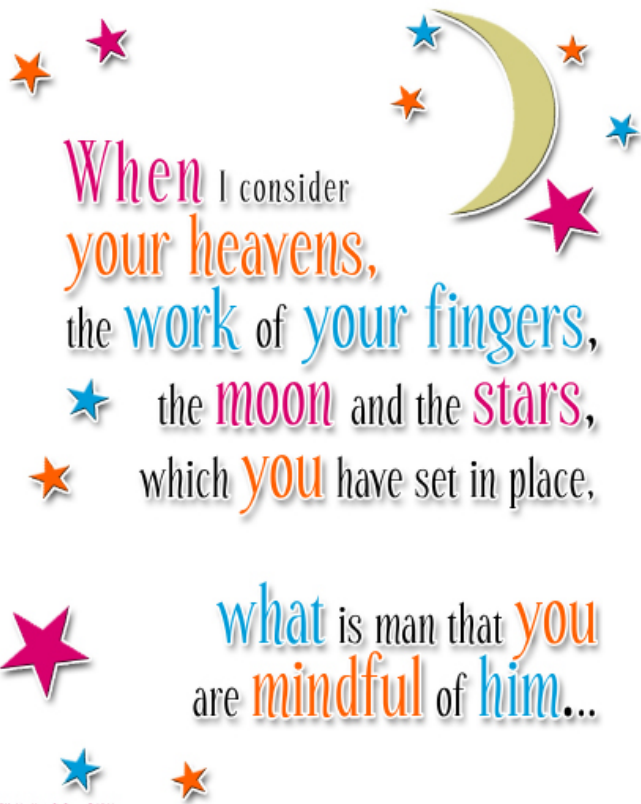

I hope that you were able to view them and ask Padre Pio to intercede to God to answer your prayer petitions! A very special thank you to the Sirignano family for all of their efforts. On Sunday, we had 19 candidates sealed with the Holy Spirit in the sacrament of Confirmation. Many of the townspeople witnessed this event.

Now, look for the fresco of the treasure chest! St. Anthony became aware of a money lender who was cheating the people when they came to borrow money. When the money lender died, at his funeral, St. Anthony said that the money lender had no heart. He quoted a scripture passage about that whatever a man treasured that's where his heart would be. After opening the man's chest, they found that there was no heart there! When they opened his treasure chest, there they found the man's heart!

Dear parish family,

How are you? I hope you are doing good and making a lot of plans for “Fathers’ Day” which we, all will be celebrating next weekend but one thing it really struck me very interesting as I sat down to write for this weekend “News from the Wheel-House” that is: before we go for celebrating the earthly fathers, this weekend celebration of the “Trinity Sunday” calls us to celebrate the love of our Heavenly Father. 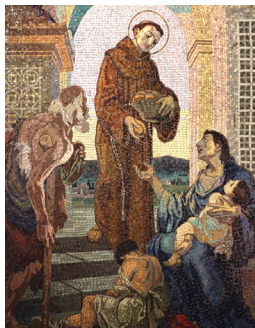

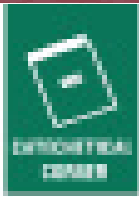

# Holy Trinity



## The Mystery of the Holy Trinity

**T**he mystery of the Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and life. God reveals himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The doctrine of the Trinity includes three truths of faith.

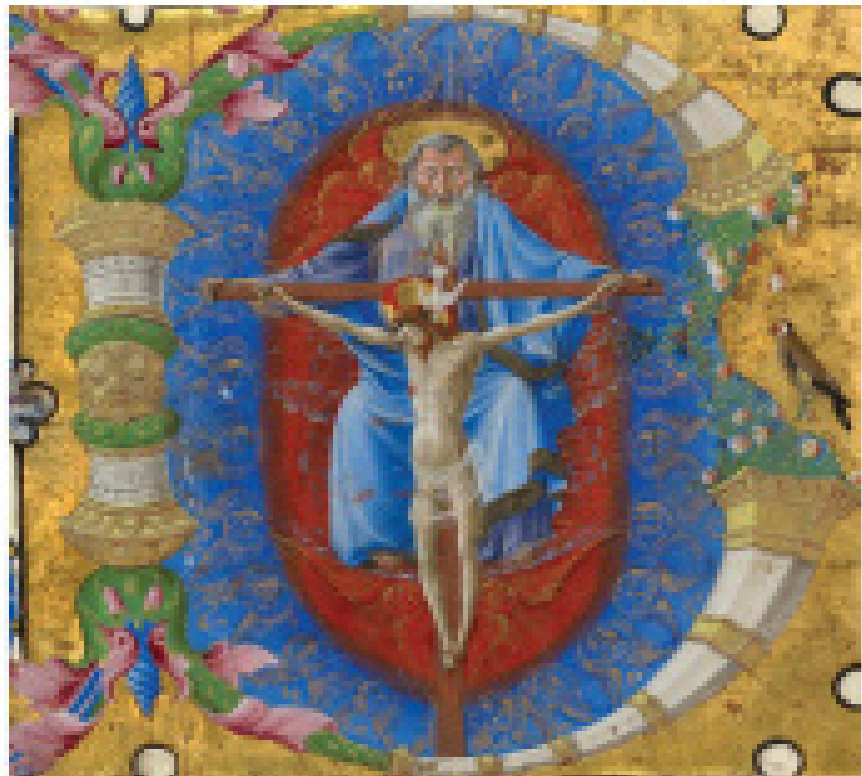
First, the Trinity is One. We do not speak of three gods but of one God. Each of the Persons is fully God. They are a unity of Persons in one divine nature.

Second, the Divine Persons are distinct from each other. Father, Son, and Spirit are not three appearances or modes of God, but three identifiable persons, each fully God in a way distinct from the others. Third, the Divine Persons are in relation to each other.

The distinction of each is understood only in reference to the others. The Father cannot be the Father without the Son, nor can the Son be the Son without the Father. The Holy Spirit is related to the Father and the Son who both send him forth.

All Christians are baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. The Trinity illumines all the other mysteries of faith.
