

News from the Wheel House

“The man who thinks only of himself says prayers of petition. He who thinks of his neighbor says prayers of intercession. He who thinks only of loving and serving God says prayers of abandonment to God’s will, and that is the prayer of the saints.” - Bishop Fulton Sheen

Dear parish family,

How are you? I hope you are staying cool, away from the heat waves. I hear that more heat waves are coming and the possibility of people getting affected. This month’s extreme temperatures came from a “heat dome” — a ridge of high pressure in the upper and middle layers of the atmosphere, trapping heat beneath it. The dome started in the Southwest and then parked itself over the Central and Eastern US. Kindly take care of yourselves. This trouble of a heat wave is not going to be permanent. As you know it is fleeting. Talking about the heat wave and our wish that it may go away quickly reminds me of our Christian practice that what we do when we are in need i.e “Prayer”. Our Lord Jesus wants us to pray and because of that He has taught us to pray. This weekend’s readings speak about this.

Here I am reminded of a joke that I read about the prayer and I want to share with you. It goes like this: Liquor shop and the power of prayer: A tale is told about a small town that had always been “dry.” One day, however, a local businessman erected a tavern. A group of Christians from a local Church were concerned and they convened an all-night prayer meeting to ask God to intervene. It just so happened that shortly thereafter lightning struck the tavern burning it down to the ground. The owner of the bar sued the Church, claiming that the prayers of the congregation were responsible, but the Church hired a lawyer to argue in court that they were not responsible. The presiding judge, after his initial review of the case, stated, “No matter how this case comes out, one thing is clear: the tavern owner believes in prayer and the Christians do not.”

You know why God wants us to pray because it helps us to be in communion with Him. Since God is love and out of love He created us, wants us to be in communion with Him. Prayer helps us to be in communion with Him and enables us to show our love for Him. Dr. Jack Hyles says “when two people talk, their minds merge. No person is exactly the same after talking to another. Communication between individuals causes a merging of the minds that is impossible to prevent”. You can’t have a close relationship with anyone, including God, without

persistent and intimate conversation. Our communion with God should be steady and without gap that is why Jesus asks us to pray unceasingly. This weekend all the readings together talk about the need and the power of the intercessory prayer, a highest form of prayer. Jesus before embracing the cross for our salvation did an intercessory prayer for you and me. We read it in the seventeenth chapter of St. John’s gospel. You know one interesting thing? This weekend we celebrate the “Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time”. The first reading, taken from the book of Genesis, gives us the model for intercessory prayer provided by Abraham in his dialogue with God. God appreciating the intercessory prayer of Abraham was granting him right away he asked. Although there were not even ten just people in those cities, God went beyond the terms of negotiation and spared the only just inhabitants of the cities, Abraham’s nephew and his family, because God is much more merciful than we are. Sodom’s destruction, in spite of Abraham’s intercession, teaches contemporary believers the valuable lesson that those who tolerate the evils perpetrated in human society and who refuse to protest against them by word, prayer and example leave themselves open to being swallowed up by them. Hereby I want to remind you that the first miracle water turned into wine by Jesus occurred because of the intercession of Blessed Mother. And so learning through the readings of this weekend the will of God we, who are engaging ourselves with prayer for us and our own, start engaging ourselves with the prayer for others – intercessory prayers. The saints engaged themselves with the prayers for others. Mission Appeal: On July 30 and 31, 2022 Rev. Sr. Glicerica C Cruz-Mary belonging to Queen of Heaven Missionaries, a religious community based in Cebu, Philippines, is doing her mission appeal at our parish. Her religious congregation fights the scourge of human trafficking and sexual exploitation through rescuing survivors and rehabilitating them. Kindly support them.
