

Reading I
2 Kgs 5:14-17

Naaman went down and plunged into the Jordan seven times at the word of Elisha, the man of God. His flesh became again like the flesh of a little child, and he was clean of his leprosy.

Naaman returned with his whole retinue to the man of God. On his arrival he stood before Elisha and said, "Now I know that there is no God in all the earth, except in Israel. Please accept a gift from your servant."

Elisha replied, "As the LORD lives whom I serve, I will not take it," and despite Naaman's urging, he still refused. Naaman said: "If you will not accept, please let me, your servant, have two mule-loads of earth, for I will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any other god except to the LORD."

Dear parish family,

Peace be with you! May God bless you and honor your faith with the favors you need!

Be a real faithful by becoming thankful: This weekend we celebrate “the Twenty Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time”. The readings of this weekend call us to have the spirit of gratitude. As we all know, daytime is getting shorter and shorter and the weather is gradually getting cooler, cold and freezing, news around the world that we hear about war, hurricane, loss, stock market crash, recession waves, shootings, above all personally the health issues and family problems that we are handling are really shredding and shattering our hope and make us feel depressed. Amidst these realities how can be thankful? We feel the reality that it is not always easy to be thankful. In fact, being thankful can be the most challenging aspect of our lives. But do you know, how amazing and wonderful to be thankful? Gratitude is a spirit-filled principle. It opens our minds to a universe full of the richness of a living God. Through it, we become spiritually aware of the wonders of the smallest things, which gladden our hearts with their messages of God’s love. This grateful awareness heightens our sensitivity to divine direction. When we communicate gratitude, we can be filled with the Spirit and connected to those around us and the Lord.
